

What is the significance of this juxtaposing between past and present selves?

- ↳ Understanding the situation that led up to the regime, the supermarket kidnapping
- ↳ To make the characters offered more relatable
- ↳ Understanding a mother's pain of losing their child
- ↳ To make it easier to imagine the loss of control
- ↳ To help readers make connections to their current lives so they can consider the worst thing which would happen if current social issues were worsened / magnified
- ↳ Showing a time where things were "normal" to make the "new normal" seem even crazier

\* By what means does the regime impose new identities of its citizens?

- ↳ Changing people's names and controlling what they can wear
- ↳ The tattoo on her ankle (numer / passport)
  - ↳ based off of the Jewish prisoners during the Nazi regime.
- ↳ giving a strict purpose making her feel like "a natural resource".
- ↳ "give me babies or I die", double meanings  
she will suffer if she doesn't produce kids
- ↳ "The choice" → faking who made her pregnant
- ↳ "I wait. I compose myself. My self is a thing I must now compose . . ."
- ↳ Psychologically manipulate
- ↳ Fear and surveillance
  - ↳ making sure people can't trust each other by having spies and allowing people to tell on each other
- ↳ Giving women importance only for her role until she starts believing it
- ↳ Give unreasonable punishments so they are fearful
- ↳ using language to manipulate and coerce people to do what they want

# Primo Levi

An Italian Jew who survived Auschwitz.

The significance and interrelationship of naming identity and power in this extract? How does this relate to Offred's experience in the state of Gilead?

- ↳ not being able to own objects is dehumanizing as objects and materials are "like limbs of our body". Objects are a "personification and evocation of our memories."
- ↳ "A man whose life or death can be lightly decided with no sense of human affinity, in the most fortunate of cases, on the basis of pure judgement of utility"
- ↳ In some ways Offred is only allowed to live because of her utility.
- ↳ tattooing is also a permanent form of writing which becomes part of who a person is
- ↳ Making people refer to themselves by their given identities makes them internalise and familiarize themselves with their new normal.
